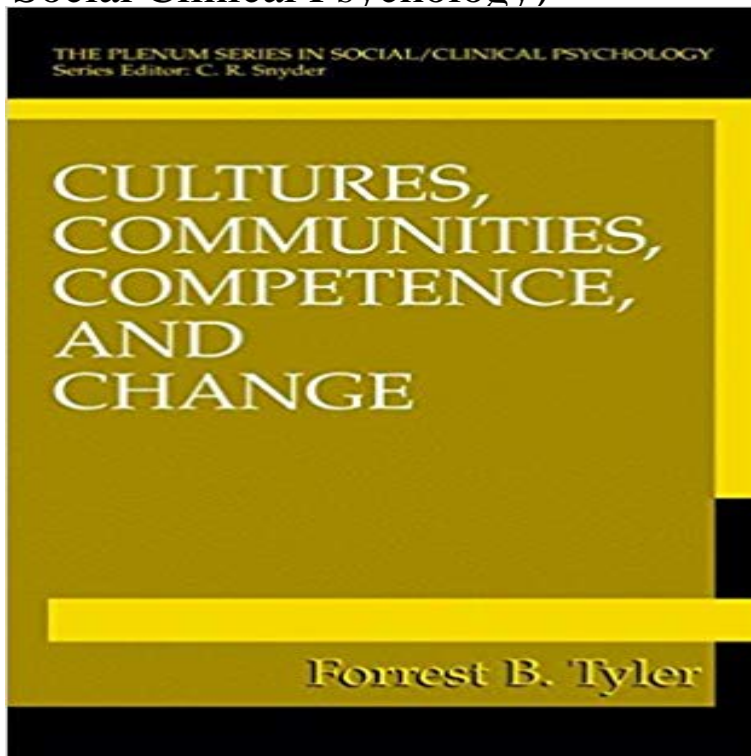


Cultures, Communities, Competence, and Change (The Springer Series in Social Clinical Psychology)
