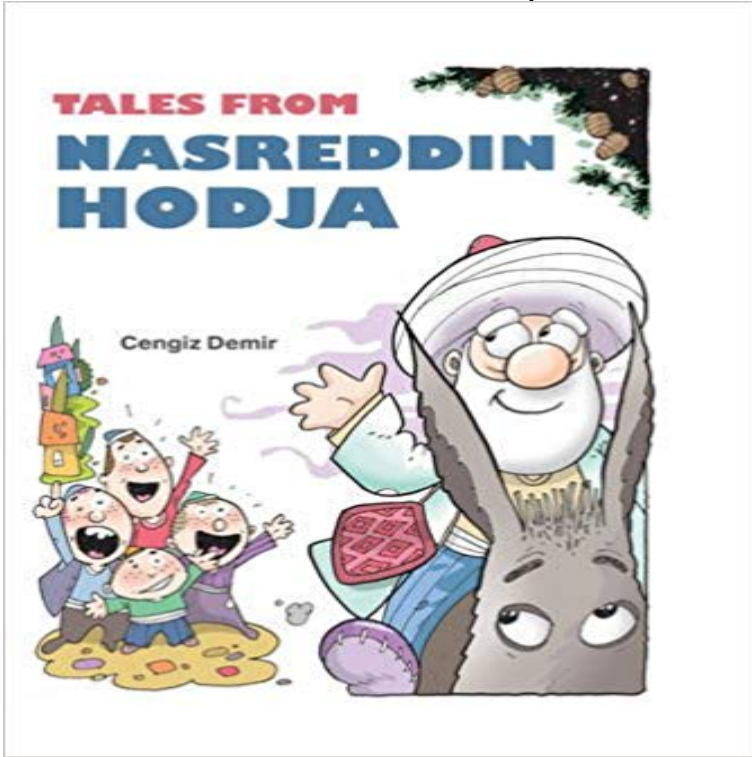


Tales from Nasreddin Hodja
