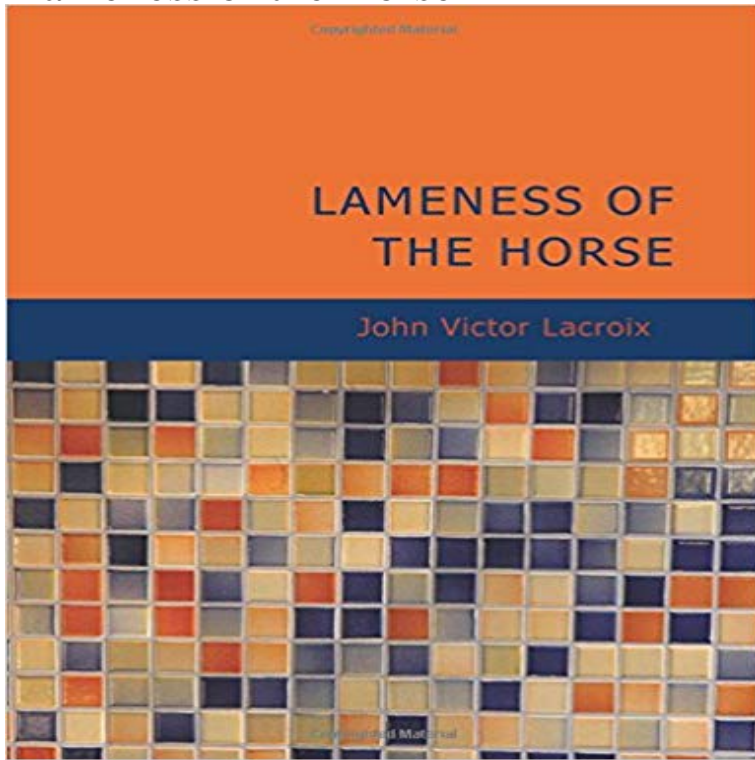

In the horse, it is most commonly caused by pain, but can be due to neurologic or mechanical dysfunction.
